<p>Description: The First Person on Scene © (FPOS) qualifications is to provide immediate life support to the patient pending the arrival of definitive pre-hospital care.</p> <p>The First Person on Scene intermediate © (FPOSi) will give learners the ability to:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • State the role of FPOSi • Manage the scene of an incident safely • Minimise the risk of infection • State the procedures required post incident • Communicate with casualties and understand the barriers of communication • Initial assessment and examination of a casualty • Administer effective Cardio Pulmonary Resuscitation (CPR) and Automated External Defibrillation (AED) to a high standard • Move and handle a patient safely • Remove a crash helmet safely • Check clear and maintain a casualties airway • Place a casualty in the recovery position • Assess and manage a casualty's respiratory system. • Recognise and manage common breathing difficulties • Assist a casualty with their breathing using a Bag Valve Mask assembly • Administer Oxygen Therapy • Manage a casualty with bleeding and wounds • Manage a casualty who is burnt 			

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- Manage a casualty with injuries to bones, joints and soft tissue.
- Manage a casualty who is in shock
- Manage a casualty with a medical emergency:
 - I. Heart Attack
 - II. Angina
 - III. Stroke
 - IV. Diabetes
 - V. Convulsions
 - VI. Asthma
 - VII. Anaphylaxis
 - Manage the safe evacuation of a casualty
 - Manage a casualty suffering from the effects of the environment.
 - Re-evaluate and monitor the casualty
 - Ensure that all post incident procedures are carried out

Qualification: On successful completion of this course, you will be awarded the First Person on Scene basic © (FPOSb) – Level 2 BTEC Award, which is valid for three years. For best practice and to avoid ‘skill fade’ we support the wide recommendation of attending an annual update in first aid.

Pre-requisites: Our course consists of practical, hands on approach that will give the learner the ability to deliver effective casualty care.

Learners must be physically able to demonstrate the ability to perform the practical elements of the course i.e Cardio Pulmonary Resuscitation in the kneeling position for a minimum of two minutes.

Assessment and certification

There are 90 minutes of knowledge and practical assessments. Knowledge is assessed by a multiple

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choice question paper; there are 25 questions and the pass mark is 70% Practical skills will be assessed by continual observation and the following skill stations:

- I. Basic Life Support
- II. Unconscious patient
- III. Control of major bleeding
- IV. Automated External Defibrillation

Learners need a basic command of English

So whilst we are often able to provide support to people who for example do not have English as a first language, our ability to do so is limited by the time available and the number of people who require assistance, although we may be able to make special arrangements if requested in advance.

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
